WILL PRESENT LEADERSHIP AWARD TO FR. FRANK DONIO, S.A.C.**



Alexandria, Va. Fr. Frank Donio, S.A.C., D.Min., M.S.C.M., will receive the 2022 Leadership Award given by the Board of Directors of the National Association of Church Personnel Administrators (NACPA) during the association's 51st annual convocation, May 1-3, in Albuquerque, New Mexico, in the Archdiocese of Santa Fe.

Fr. Donio is the Executive Director of the Conference of Major Superiors of Men (CMSM) and Founding Director of the Catholic Apostolate Center.

The NACPA Leadership Award recognizes a current member, member organization or loyal partner who has demonstrated exemplary leadership on behalf of just treatment in the Church workplace. This year's recipient, Fr. Donio, has consistently provided outstanding leadership, guidance and service to those serving in the Human Resources ministry of the Church.

According to Regina Haney, Ed.D., executive director of NACPA, Fr. Donio is a key founder of NACPA's Certificate Program for Those Moving to Human Resources Responsibility in a Catholic Workplace which was established in 2018. From its inception, Fr. Donio has been an active participant in this initiative, serving as one of the four presenters in the program on the topic of Catholic Social Teaching in a Catholic Workplace.

In 2019 Fr. Donio co-authored NACPA's seminal publication, *Just Treatment for Those Who Work for the Church*, second edition. His leadership in this revised edition influenced the inclusion of Church policies, best practices and documents.

Fr. Donio continues to provide essential educational opportunities for NACPA's members and association friends. He recently served as a panelist for NACPA's popular webinar, True Leadership in the Church.

Dr. Haney added, "Few people better embody the spirit of the NACPA Leadership Award. In recognizing Fr. Donio we celebrate a true servant leader."

From its headquarters in Alexandria, Va., NACPA promotes leadership in human resources, finance and administration that models Gospel values, promoting justice in the workplace. The association strives to strengthen working relationships among Catholic diocesan, parish and school leaders, ministers and employees and to help develop Church personnel and human resource skills.
